The Electronic Frontier Foundation is asking universities around the country to protect their inventions from patent trolls by signing the <u>Public Interest Patent Pledge</u>. The PIPP is a promise that before selling or licensing its patents to a third party, a university will assess the business practices of that party and make sure that it will use those patents responsibly.

Ask your university to sign the PIPP.
